## MEMORABLE MOMENTS IN SPORTING NEWS HISTORY

**September 17, 1942** - An announcement on page 5 says "Football Next Week," indicating that the weekly will begin regular coverage of college and professional football. Coverage of college basketball and professional hockey began later that fall but run only to the start of baseball's spring training.

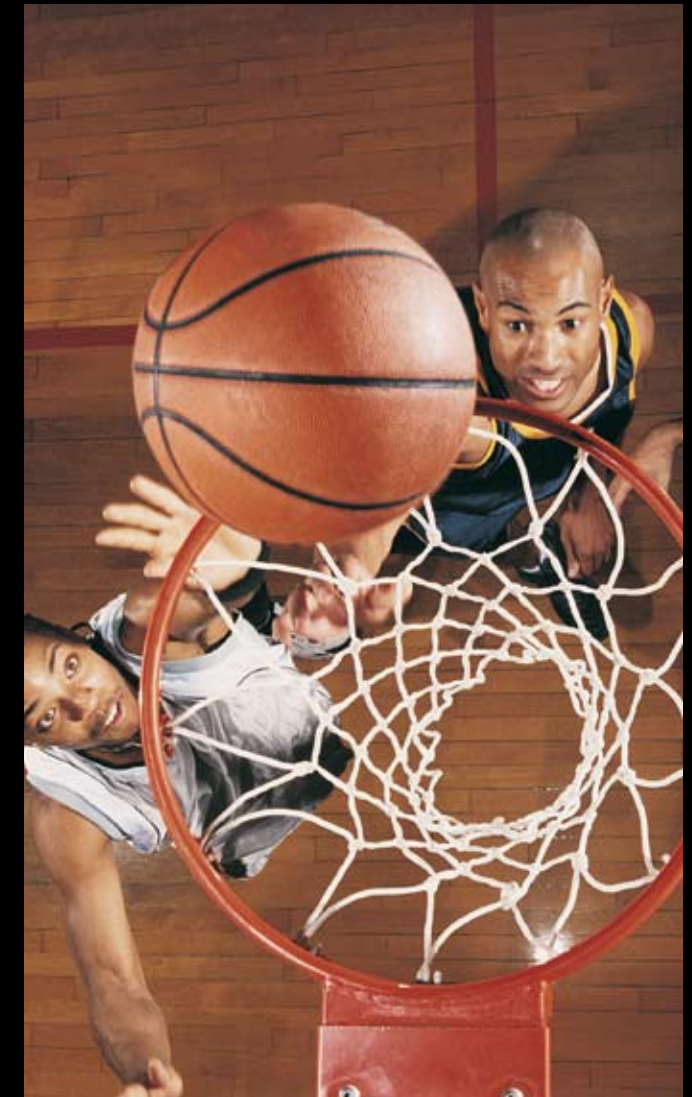

## MEMORABLE MOMENTS IN SPORTING NEWS HISTORY

**1918** - During World War I, publisher Taylor Spink persuades American League president Ban Johnson to purchase 150,000 copies of each weekly issue and have them sent to American troops fighting in Europe. A similar program was initiated during World War II.

**January 12, 1977** - The Times Mirror Company announces the purchase of Sporting News Publishing Company. A family-owned business since its inception, TSN had been run by three generations of the Spink family: Al, his brother Charles, Charles' son Taylor, and Taylor's son C.C. Johnson Spink.

## MEMORABLE MOMENTS IN SPORTING NEWS HISTORY

**MARCH 17, 1886** - Sportswriter Al Spink publishes the first issue of Sporting News in St. Louis. It runs eight pages and costs a nickel with a yearly subscription pegged \$2.00. Front page stories cover harness racing, professional wrestling and baseball with headlines such as "The Game in Gotham," "Harry Wright's Team" and "The White Stockings."

**1903** - Sporting News editor A.J. Flanner is one of three sportswriters called upon to help draft the National Agreement that brought peace between the established National League and the upstart American League. The agreement is typeset in the Sporting News composing room and approved by major league owners, leading to the first modern World Series.

**1910** - After nearly a quarter-century as an "all-sports" publication, Sporting News eliminates coverage of all other sports besides baseball, tying its fortunes to the immense popularity of the National Pastime. The masthead on page 1 now reads "Official Organ, National Commission, Authority of Game."

**JULY 1, 1943** - After more than 57 years as a full-size newspaper, Sporting News becomes a tabloid. The reduced size complies with the federal government's decision to ration and conserve paper during World War II. TSN remains a tabloid until becoming a magazine in the 1990s.

**1962** - The National Baseball Hall of Fame creates the J.G. Taylor Spink Award, voted upon annually to honor "meritorious contributions to baseball writing" and presented at the Hall's induction ceremony. The first winner is Spink himself.

**APRIL 8, 1967** - Sporting News cover features color photography for the first time, a picture of Baltimore Orioles outfielder Frank Robinson. In September, Buffalo Bills quarterback Jack Kemp is featured on TSN's first non-baseball color cover.

**JANUARY 4, 1969** - Sporting News inaugurates its Man of the Year award, honoring Detroit Tigers pitcher Denny McLain for winning 31 games during the 1968 season. The next four annual winners are pitcher Tom Seaver, basketball coach John Wooden, golfer Lee Trevino and baseball owner Charlie Finley.

**MARCH 18, 1991** - Sporting News becomes a magazine with the publication of the first part of a three-part series on expansion in sports. The publication's editorial focus is the "Big Six" sports: baseball, college football, pro football, college basketball, pro basketball and hockey. NASCAR joins this mix in 2001.

**JANUARY, 1997** - Sporting News makes its debut on the World Wide Web by unveiling its website, [www.sportingnews.com](http://www.sportingnews.com). A year later, the website wins an "Ellie," the National Magazine Award for Outstanding Achievement, General Excellence, New Media.



**JANUARY 7, 1991** - Sporting News publishes its first list of "The 100 Most Powerful People in Sports." No. 1 on the list is Laurence Tisch, chairman of CBS, then broadcasting major league baseball, the National Football League, the NCAA basketball playoffs, the Olympic Winter Games and other key sporting events. The next four No. 1s are NBA Commissioner David Stern, Nike's Phil Knight, Ted Turner and Rupert Murdoch.
